RCM Issues- Saturday, December 10th

> Several Areas transitioning to Consensus Based Decision Making (CBDM) and have requested ESH from body.

The RD/RDA coming out to Areas has been helpful. Are there other materials to help? One idea was to put up tutorial videos on website. Updates with website would make it capable of hosting streaming video. A perspective was offered that a live workshop would probably be more helpful. Can be challenging to attract newer members to workshops; to make it interesting. Areas that have implemented CBDM made several suggestions: best way to learn is just "to do it", be aware that it will take time because it's a culture change, this is not a "one time thing" but a process and preparedness is also crucial. One RCM offered to attend an Area meeting as a support resource. Straw poll: Areas operating under Robert's Rules- 3, CBDM- 9, Hybrid- 1. One member suggested that there is a component to the transition involving Traditions and Concepts and how they complement one another. A lot of interest on the floor about a workshop at the next Region.

➤ A representative for Savannah Low Country (Charles) reported a split in his Area, and that SLCA still exists with 5 groups and will be meeting in Statesboro on January 8th. Greg, serving as Area Treasurer, challenged this, stating that there was a name change of the area and not a split.

RCM of the Greater Savannah Area (Vicki L.) would not be present due to a Funeral but would be present on Sunday. Much discussion ensued on the floor by many members of the body. Some concerns addressed: Who will be recognized by the floor? What is the truth? What really happened? How can Region help? What about unity? How does this affect the division of service bodies? How does this affect the Newcomer? What are the legal factors involved with incorporation issues and bank accounts—because Region does not get involved in legal issues. What is the official procedure for recognition on the Region floor; who sits at the table? Consensus on the floor: a mediation process to preserve unity would be a solution and that issues must not be worked out on the Region floor, especially since there is such a lack of information. RD/RDA, along with the other members of Admin body, offered to mediate. In order for Region to function today, for business dealings on Saturday, Representative from SLCA will be recognized since other RCM of GSA not present.

Georgia Regional Service Committee Treasurer's Report – December 11, 2016 Prepared by Karen M. Treasurer

Dear Fellowship,

Since the last Region we have received three bank statements for September, October, and November 2016. Greg, our RD witnessed that the bank statements from the post office were unopened upon arrival at region. The reconciliation reports, bank statements, cleared checks and deposit slips for each of these months was audited on 12/10/16 by Tate, the region facilitator and Mike, the RCMA from East End Area. All statements were found to be accurate and in order. There is one check that has not cleared the bank. It is check #2189 to Shaw Industries for \$98.90. Total cleared deposits for September, October, and November 2016 was \$4715.97. We started December region with \$9,429.53 in our bank account. The income was \$2,274.75 less than what we spent.

This December 2016 RSC, 7th Tradition deposit will be \$3,882.78. There is also a deposit in the amount of \$4.45 from H&I Learning Day from November 2015 that was monies left over from the event. After checks printed at the December 2016 region we have \$8,610.03 in the account. The income was \$819.50 less than what we spent. Our prudent reserve is \$13,321.25, so we have a shortage of \$4,711.22. One of the reasons why we have used our prudent reserve is our insurance bill was paid and the budget was increased in which the prudent reserve of 33% was increased. We are using our prudent reserve for our expenses and this is the exact reason why we have one. Our administrative board has discussed going into our prudent reserve and just wanted our region to know we are using it. We are not worried, as it will all work out.

Hugh R. met me at Suntrust Bank and became a signer on the account.

It seems like my reports are always about the previous region, and I can produce this regions treasurer reports right now. So I am going to include December 2016 reports today.

During this last quarter, I attended four events on behalf of the region and conducted two workshops on **CBDM** at West End and Chattahoochee Flint River

<u>Multi-zonal Service Symposium</u> - Milwaukee, WI.

Several workshops were informative but the most intriguing was the one on the Future of the Conference. I have included the deck with my report and I will address further down.

Zonal Meeting – Greensboro, N.C.

The focus on the meeting was to

- 1). Define the Purpose of the Zone and
- 2). Develop a plan that would serve the Regions

The reason for our approach was that if we could define the role of the zones as they affect the regions we would have a better direction for how we establish the functionality of the WSC. There has been a lot of talk about changing the World Service Conference from a Motion Driven event to a Strategic Planning Event. The overriding idea that is in the beginning of taking shape is to make the conference a place where we write the CAR.

What we came away with was three task committees.

- 1. PR
- 2. Hand I and
- 3. Service Delivery

Our investment in adobe connect is paying off.

Alabama NW Florida uses Adobe connect in their region to put on webinars. South Florida conducts webinars and gets participation from as far away as places like Germany and Puerto Rico.

There was a conversation about conducting an inventory at the conference and an audit of the FIPT. The NC Region put this on the floor. There may be some merit in some of these ideas so more will be revealed.

Zonal Budget

In the guidelines this body voted on, the zone established a Zonal budget. The budget for 2 years is \$15,750. Divided by 6 regions would be approximately \$1,300 per year. I am not asking for that check this weekend but will come to the body in March to take this up.

FIPT Letter: I received confirmation from one other ASC that they were in agreement with the letter.

NAWS received input from 49 of whom were regions. The response was 22 would approve the statement as written, 16 would approve it if revised, and 11 would never approve it. Given that fewer than half of delegates responded to the survey, there does not seem to a conscience on releasing a statement from the WSC. The World Board will release a statement that reports on the WSC discussions, decisions, and straw polls perhaps along with some historical context.

PR/FD Zonal Contact: The 2016–2018 NAWS Strategic Plan includes a project focused on the relationship between public relations and fellowship development and the need for more collaboration and planning. This cycle's strategy is to "Support the efforts of NA service bodies —especially those of zonal forums—to strengthen and grow NA as part of a coordinated, comprehensive PR strategy that advances the Vision for NA Services." Zones are asking to provide a point person.

IDTs: NAWS is working on the Issue Discussion Topic material for this cycle. The three topics this cycle are

- Applying our principles to technology and social media
- Our vision statement and atmosphere of recovery
- Introduction to our new book Guiding Principles

Recovery Literature Projects: NAWs is collecting input to help shape two recovery literature projects. These will be in the project plans for WSC 2018. One is a meditation book and another is an IP on recovery and mental illness/mental health. Just like the Traditions Book, we are being urged to help with this. There are webpages for each project with input questions online.

World Environmental Scan

NAWS uses a tool for planning called the Environmental Scan. This tool is used by World Services to survey the current state of the fellowship. It has questions pertaining to the health of the structure of our organization as well as our relationship with outside entities. Along with that, it is surveying trends that we detect. This is something that we need to fill out at the next RSC. I will include this in my report or the next communication with you.

Georgia Regional Service Committee Treasurer's Report – December 11, 2016 Prepared by Karen M. Treasurer

Dear Fellowship,

Since the last region we have received three bank statements for September, October, and November 2016. Greg, our RD witnessed that the bank statements from the post office were unopened upon arrival at region. The reconciliation reports, bank statements, cleared checks and deposit slips for each of these months was audited on 12/10/16 by Tate, the region facilitator and Mike, the RCMA from East End Area. All statements were found to be accurate and in order. There is one check that has not cleared the bank. It is check #2189 to Shaw Industries for \$98.90. Total cleared deposits for September, October, and November 2016 was \$4715.97. We started December region with \$9,429.53 in our bank account. The income was \$2,274.75 less than what we spent.

This December 2016 RSC, 7th Tradition deposit will be \$3,882.78. There is also a deposit in the amount of \$4.45 from H&I Learning Day from November 2015 that was monies left over from the event. After checks printed at the December 2016 region we have \$8,610.03 in the account. The income was \$819.50 less than what we spent. Our prudent reserve is \$13,321.25, so we have a shortage of \$4,711.22. One of the reasons why we have used our prudent reserve is our insurance bill was paid and the budget was increased in which the prudent reserve of 33% was increased. We are using our prudent reserve for our expenses and this is the exact reason why we have one. Our administrative board has discussed going into our prudent reserve and just wanted our region to know we are using it. We are not worried, as it will all work out.

Hugh R. met me at Suntrust Bank and became a signer on the account.
