What is a "Bridge Program?

A Temporary Contact Program – Helping inmates / clients / addicts in correctional & treatment facilities to transition to outside Narcotics Anonymous meetings

Addicts nearing release from facilities and institutions can experience feelings of fear about re-entering society. They may worry that they won't find the support to keep their recovery going. Narcotics Anonymous can help.

We "Bridge the Gap" so newly clean don't have to walk alone across that scary gap between the beginning of recovery they found through H & I meetings in facilities and the rest of recovery in NA. We will now also be able to reach the addicts that have not been able to hear our life saving message through H & I while in an institution by providing our "Information / Contact Request Form" to counselors, wardens, chaplains & RSAT contacts throughout the state of Georgia.

The programs outlined below will give the Narcotics Anonymous in the Georgia Region the opportunity to fill a void in the exit process that has been missing, helping addicts find our meetings: "Meetings keep us in touch with where we've been, but more importantly with where we could go in our recovery" Basic Text Pg 54

<u>Basic Program</u>: Shortly after receiving a completed request form for information, a Georgia Region Bridging Program Project Coordinator will contact the addict by sending a welcome packet that includes a meeting schedule for the area they are being released to and two NA pamphlets and a welcome letter.

<u>Full Program</u>: Will include the Basic Program and the addict will then be assigned a volunteer / temporary NA contact in the area in which they are being released that can meet them at their first few NA meetings. In those first critical days, the temporary NA contact will make introductions to other members of Narcotics Anonymous, and share his/her experience of recovery as experienced through the Narcotics Anonymous program.

How the Newly Clean can Request a Temporary NA Contact

The chances of recovering alone are not good. If an addict would like help in bridging the gap from an NA member volunteer in the Georgia Region Bridge Program between release and their first few meetings, they can complete the "Information / Contact Request Form" found in this document. Form must be mailed to a designated PO Box for Georgia Region Bridge Program.

The basic premise of anonymity allows addicts to attend meetings without fear of legal or social repercussions. This is an important consideration for an addict thinking about going to a meeting for the first time. Anonymity also supports an atmosphere of equality in meetings. It helps insure that no individual's personality or circumstance will be considered more important than the message of recovery shared in NA.

- The Basic Program can be implemented right away!
- The Full Program will take time to implement, it will require coordination of gaining and tracking volunteers to meet newly clean at their first meeting.

- Budget will be submitted for Basic Program in 2012 2013. We will have topic to submit budget attached for this project.
- Budget will be submitted for Full Program during regular budget procedures in March 2013

GEORGIA REGION BRIDGE PROGRAM BASIC BRIDGE PROGRAM PROJECT GUIDELINES

- 1. The Georgia Region Basic Bridge Program is a project that will be under the umbrella of Region H & I as our volunteers will receive initial requests from the newly clean that are currently in a facility.
- 2. The Georgia Region Basic Bridge Program will work in cooperation with the combined efforts of the H&I, PR and WSR subcommittees of the Georgia Region of Narcotics Anonymous. Working in cooperation with these sub-committees will help the Georgia Region Bridge Program introduce facilities and the newly clean to a resource in their community. NA is available to them immediately upon exiting a facility and our purpose provides the opportunity to assist addicts to transition to active membership in the community by establishing temporary NA contact:
 - a. Providing information about Narcotics Anonymous to the newly clean who request it, to include information pamphlets (IP's),
 - b. Meeting schedule(s) for the expected Area of Georgia for their release / living arrangements
 - c. Welcome letter from Georgia Region Bridge Program
- 3. The Georgia Region Basic Bridge Program will be for one year as volunteers for full program are registered and volunteer data base is collected for each area of the Georgia Region.
- 4. The Georgia Region Bridge Program will work in cooperation by providing forms to H & I sub-committees who can distribute forms to the newly clean at H & I meetings prior to their going home.
- 5. The Georgia Region Bridge Program will work in cooperation with PR by providing forms and program information that can be used during presentations to facilities. The bridge program can be a resource in the community that facilities can use for their clients upon release. PR is a vital tool to help us get forms into facilities where there are currently no H & I meetings being held within the facilities.
- 6. The Georgia Region Bridge Program will work in cooperation with WSR committees to take the newly clean recovery to the next level upon release. WSR could include a temporary contact form with their packet when corresponding prior to their release.
- 7. All completed forms must be mailed in to PO Box for the Georgia Region Basic Bridge Program
- 8. Packet will be sent to the newly clean within two weeks from the time initial request form received.
- 9. Packets will include the following:
 - Staying Clean on the Outside & Welcome to Narcotics Anonymous
 - Meeting schedule(s) for the expected Area of Georgia for their living arrangements
 - Welcome letter from Georgia Region Bridge Program
- 10. Statistics will be tracked and reported to Georgia Region H & I on Quarterly Basis.

- 11. Tracking / Reports to include how many facilities have forms, what facilities we are working on getting the forms into and status updates on H & I actually getting forms to facilities where we already have meetings.
- 12. Tracking / Reports to include how many requests received and # for each Area requested.

We will start recruiting volunteers for full program to be rolled out in phases.

Information / Contact Request Form Narcotics Anonymous

Our experience has shown that attending an NA meeting on the outside the same day you are released is one of the most important things you can do for your recovery. Narcotics Anonymous has begun a transition program called Georgia Region Bridge Program. The Georgia Region Bridge Program will send you information about Narcotics Anonymous. Upon your release or relocating to your home address, a volunteer may meet you at your first few meetings, introduce you to other NA members, and help you get acquainted and comfortable among new friends in NA. During this time, some of the things you will learn about are sponsors, home groups, working the steps, and service.

Your Georgia Region Bridge Program volunteer is only temporary. They won't follow you around or control your activities, nor will they provide you with a job, money, housing, food, clothing, or any other such service. The volunteer is NOT a sponsor, not even a temporary sponsor. We believe that it is best for you to choose a sponsor for yourself once you are released.

It is our hope that this service will help you find the solution that we have found. Our purpose is to carry the message of recovery, "That no addict, anywhere, need die from the horrors of addiction."

GEORGIA REGION BRIDGE PROGRAM FULL PROGRAM GUIDELINES

The Georgia Region Bridge Full Program includes all criteria of the basic program. The full program is an extension of the basic bridge program and includes the following:

- a. **NA volunteers**: Meeting the member at their first few meetings and introducing to local NA members, providing current meeting schedule, share personal experience of their recovery and service.
- b. **Web-based program** that is easily accessible to anyone interested in different services and greatly reduces costs to the Georgia Region. Website to include the following:
 - Outline of the Georgia Region Bridge Program and how to contact
 - Designated email to contact the Georgia Region Bridge Program
 - Temporary Contact Volunteer sign up via the website
 - Section for Professionals to request temporary contact for residents
 - Section for any addict seeking help to request temporary contact
 - Automated response emails sent with additional links of information
 - Online program provides easy tracking for all requests received

Volunteers:

- 1. Georgia Region Bridge Program volunteers demonstrate an ability to carry a clear and consistent message of recovery in Narcotics Anonymous.
- 2. Georgia Region Bridge Program volunteers must have at least one year continuous clean time with a working knowledge of the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Narcotics Anonymous.
- 3. Georgia Region Bridge Program volunteers must have a willingness to serve and the ability to answer requests in a timely manner
- 4. No personal or improper conduct of any kind, i.e. personal information, photographs, sexual content, religious materials, email addresses. Ask yourself before you interact, "Would I want everyone to know that I said or did this? Remember that you will be viewed as representing Narcotics Anonymous.

- 5. As it is always suggested when doing NA 12-Step work, do not go alone when meeting new members at NA Meetings, always take another member with you or have someone meet you there.
- 6. Keep the Project Coordinator up-to-date on your work in this area. Volunteers will need to send a completed "Volunteer Report Form" upon completion of the transitioning of new member to the outside NA meetings and NA community.

Do's & Don'ts of Bridge Program

- DO respond to written requests for information within 2 weeks.
- DO meet the member at an NA meeting within 48 hours of their release.
- DO view your first meeting with the member as you would any other 12-Step call and take another member along.
- DO accompany the member to a variety of meetings and review the many different meeting i.e. open vs. closed, book study, step study, question & answer, etc.
- DO make sure they receive an updated meeting schedule and NA literature.
- DO encourage them to introduce themselves and ask for phone numbers.
- DO explain group membership and the value of having a home group.
- DO explain sponsorship and refer to IP#11 "Sponsorship." Introduce the member to potential sponsors.
- DO carry a clear and consistent NA message.
- DO help them find 2-3 meetings in their Area and remind them that this is a temporary arrangement.
- DO discuss any questions or problems with the Bridge Program Coordinator and/or your sponsor.
- DO keep to our basic principle when helping of men with the men, and women with the women.
- DON'T sponsor the member, even temporarily. It is important that they meet and build relationships with as many other NA members as possible.
- DON'T loan money, or provide housing, food, clothing, car, job, or any other welfare, social, or legal services.
- DON'T provide domestic or vocational counseling; provide detoxification, medical or psychiatric services.
- DON'T be involved in reports to the Justice System. Remember our 12th Tradition Anonymity is vital!
- DON'T become emotionally or romantically involved.
- DON'T be responsible for the member's actions or attitudes in or out of the meetings.
- DON'T accept money or gifts for your services, or any contributions from non-NA sources.
- DON'T volunteer if you have been a victim of, or an accomplice to a crime that someone is currently incarcerated for.
- DON'T engage in conversations about the incarcerated member's crime.

Some questions for potential Georgia Region Bridge Program Volunteers to think about and use as a tool to measure your commitment:

- 1. Is your recovery based in Narcotics Anonymous? Explain.
- 2. Do you have an NA sponsor?
- 3. Do you work the steps of Narcotics Anonymous?
- 4. Do you sponsor others in Narcotics Anonymous?
- 5. Do you attend NA meetings regularly?
- 6. Do you have at least one year continuous clean time?
- 7. Do you have a clear working knowledge of the Twelve Traditions of NA?
- 8. Do you have a relationship with any person that may be getting released to your area soon?
- 9. Do you have a family member with any person that may be getting released to your area soon?
- 10. Have you thought about whether this service work could be a problem or conflict for you, i.e. what if you find out the person you are helping served time for something you find morally wrong?
- 11. Have you spoken with your NA sponsor about becoming involved with this type of service work?
- 12. Have you ever done a 12th step call before?
- 13. Do you want to take time to help new members learn about Narcotics Anonymous?
- 14. Could this program have helped you or someone you know when getting released from a facility?
- 15. Do you think this program can help new members find a home in NA? Explain

Sample Letter

Dear Friend,

Thank you for contacting Narcotics Anonymous.

NA is a fellowship of men and women for whom drugs had become a major problem. By following the program of recovery offered in Narcotics Anonymous, our members have found a way to live clean as responsible, productive members of society. NA is an international fellowship, with more than 32,000 meetings a week in over 113 countries. Our literature is translated into 47 languages. There are no dues or fees in Narcotics Anonymous. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using and you are a member when you say you are.

While you are still in an institution there are some things you can do to work on your own program of recovery. In Chapter 5 of the Basic Text it states, "If you are in an institution of any kind and have stopped using for the present, you can with a clear mind try this way of life.

Upon release, continue your daily program and contact a member of NA. Do this by mail, by phone, or in person. Better yet, come to our meetings." Our bridge program is designed to meet you at your first meetings and introduce you to NA members in your Area.

Enclosed are some information pamphlets and a meeting schedule that will be of help to you now and upon your release:

- The meeting schedule is for the Area in which you will be going upon your release.
- Having an NA Member contact you upon your release and meet you at an NA meeting
- Introduce you to other NA members in your area at the meeting
- The pamphlets have important information to help you transition to outside meetings.
 - o Staying Clean on the Outside
 - Welcome to Narcotics Anonymous

Some additional suggestions that have worked for others on their journey of recovery are:

- Don't use no matter what
- Go to 90 meetings in 90 days
- Get a sponsor
- Read our N.A. literature

We hope that this letter and the information we have enclosed has given you some direction and we hope to see you at your first meeting in the community upon your release.

When at the end of the road we find that we can no longer function as a human being, either with or without drugs, we all face the same dilemma. What is there left to do? There seems to be this alternative: either go on as best we can to the bitter ends – jails, institutions, or death – or find a new way to live. In years gone by, very few addicts ever had this last choice. Those who are addicted today are more fortunate. For the first time in history, a simple way has been proving itself in the lives of many addicts. It is available to us all. This is a simple spiritual – not religious – program, known as Narcotics Anonymous.

AREA GEOGRAPHICAL VOLUNTEER LOCATIONS:

Upon new release information received – volunteers will be needed throughout the Georgia Region and will first be defined by City getting released to. Then a meeting schedule will be sent for that Area. Area's are as follows:

CENTRAL MAIL LOCATION:

Mail box needs to be check 2 times per week! Inmates / clients get new release dates weekly and unable to wait until quarterly Region meetings to collect mail. A designated mail box has been obtained as we have received over 75 requests this year!

PROCESSES:

- All Georgia Region Bridge Program correspondence will be sent to the Post Office box.
- Mail from the P.O. Box will be picked up by the project coordinator approximately twice a week
- Upon receipt of the mail by the project coordinator, the project coordinator will:

document the received date:

document the total pieces of mail received from the P.O. Box;

document the total pieces of mail received for each of the 15 geographical area locations listed above;

identify and document the type correspondence received; and mail initial packet

assign each request for temporary contact to a volunteer in city located in Area of release and provide the volunteer with details of release date and phone number contact the volunteer to verify meeting date set, contact complete and transition successful.

The communication of release information to the volunteer from the coordinator should occur within 7 days of the received date.

The Georgia Region Bridge Program volunteer will confirm their reply to the request within **ONE WEEK** from the date it was received. The volunteer will retain a copy of their response, and provide the copy and the date their response was sent back to the Coordinator. The Coordinator will then document the date the reply was confirmed, in addition to retaining the copy of the volunteers reply for quality management.

A follow-up after contact is completed should be sent to project coordinator. Volunteer will complete the "Bridge Volunteer Contact Completion" form and send in via website, email or regular mail.

PROJECT COORDINATOR SERVICE POSITION REQUIREMENTS:

The PC must have least three years of continuous clean time with a working knowledge of the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Narcotics Anonymous; Must work in cooperation with Region H & I, WSR & PR Sub-Committees Has the ability to define tasks required for implementation of a successful program and assign volunteers to complete designated tasks. See task list.

Has the availability to prepare and present quarterly reports to the Georgia Region; full tracking of program for requests & volunteers & contacts confirmed.

Has a willingness and desire to serve and have the ability to document accurately; Has the ability to respond and perform the duties of their position in a timely manner.

PROJECT VOLUNTEER SERVICE POSITION REQUIREMENTS:

The VOLUNTEER must have least one years of continuous clean time with a working knowledge of the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Narcotics Anonymous

Has the ability to explain service structure, sponsorship & our NA literature; Has the ability to complete forms reporting the transition process Has the availability drive distance to meet new members at meeting Has a willingness and desire to serve and introduce to NA members in Area; Has the ability to perform the duties of their position in a timely manner.

Volunteers will need to be accountable and communicate all bridging service completed to the Georgia Region Bridge Program Coordinator.

Georgia Region Bridge Program Announcement

The Georgia Region fellowship has adopted a new state-wide project called "The Georgia Region Bridge Program". The purpose of the bridge program is to provide a "Bridge" between people reentering their communities from in-patient treatment or incarceration and their first meeting of Narcotics Anonymous.

3 WAYS TO SIGN UP TO VOLUNTEER

HOW IT WORKS

When you volunteer, you we ask you to provide your name, telephone number, your email address, the community in which you attend meetings, your clean date, your gender, and your age group. This information is used to match you to the newcomer. It is only viewed by the Bridge committee members and is never released to any other NA member or outside organization.

When a request for a temporary contact is received, you will get a phone call to see if you are available to help out. You can always decline and we will ask you again the next time. The newcomer's contact information will be given to the first available volunteer.

You will arrange to connect with the newcomer at a meeting as soon as possible. At the meeting you will introduce the newcomer to other members of the fellowship, explain about NA literature, provide a meeting list, and encourage the newcomer to join in fellowship after the meeting. You will make additional arrangements to meet at two or three meetings over the next couple of weeks.

This is not a temporary sponsor program. It is simply helping the newcomer feel welcome and connected to the fellowship. That is all there is to it. Help make this program a success and volunteer today.
